
Choose from rural retreats to city breaks

Decide how long your holiday will be

We offer a range of holidays from three-night weekends and four-night midweek getaways, to one week, 10 days or two weeks – or more! Holidays can start on a Friday, Saturday, Monday or Tuesday, depending on the boat you choose. Holidays from Silsden are offered every day of the week except Wednesdays.

Our collection and return times

Boats are ready to collect from 3pm on the afternoon of your holiday start date. And you'll need to return your boat at 9am on the final day of your holiday, or the afternoon before if you've made arrangements with the booking team. Please bear this in mind when deciding where to moor on your last night.

Learning the ropes

You don't need to have any boating experience to enjoy our holidays. When you arrive to pick up your boat, one of our instructors will take you through everything you need to know – how to start the engine, fill up with water, steer, slow down, moor up and work the locks.

There's a manual on board every boat if you need to check on anything and our engineering teams are always on hand – 24 hours a day – to help over the phone or come out to you if you need them.

We also have a Boat Handover video online that you can watch in advance of your trip, and a series of short 'how to' videos to help you along the way.


You can buy a waterway map in advance from our booking office or at one of our boat yard shops.

Departing from the World Heritage City of Bath, or from the outskirts of the City at Brassknocker Basin, these bases offer cruising along the Kennet & Avon Canal, one of the most popular waterways on the network.

Sydney Wharf

From Bristol in the west, to Reading in the east, this stretch of water will capture your imagination and highlight the diverse range of unique experiences an Anglo Welsh narrowboat holiday has to offer. From simple weekend cruises to wonderful weeks and fabulous fortnights, we're as flexible as you are!

Bath makes a fantastic short break destination. The stunning Caen Hill flight of locks on the Kennet & Avon Canal at Devizes is also a popular destination from our Bath base. Foxhanger Wharf, at the base of the flight, has visitor moorings and a place to turn around.

Head west from Sydney Wharf, and in just 5 minutes you'll reach Visitor Moorings in the heart of the World Heritage City of Bath. From here, it's a short walk into Bath City Centre where you can visit the natural hot springs and Thermae Spa, Roman Baths and other iconic attractions.

Head further towards the setting sun along the River Avon to Bristol. 'Jump ship' with your crew and visit Brunel's masterpiece, the SS Great Britain, or wander through the Underwater Tunnel at Bristol Aquarium.

Monkton Combe

Re-opened by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in 1990, the Kennet & Avon Canal stretches 87 miles, connecting the Bristol Avon in the west with the River Thames at Reading. It will take you through some of the country's best-loved landscapes, including the Bath Valley, Vale of Pewsey and North Wessex Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

Our Brassknocker Basin base at the end of the Somerset Coal Canal, just a short two-hour cruise from the centre of Bath, is one of our favourite starting points.

With a fabulous rural setting on the City's doorstep, our friendly base team is ready to help with your holiday and ensure you make the best of both worlds.

You'll soon be setting off, enjoying the fresh air, spotting darting kingfishers, listening to the gentle wash of water against the side of the boat, sipping coffee, giving a friendly wave to fellow boaters and forgetting about the rest of the world.

Featured Routes

Route 1: Short Break - Avoncliff Aqueduct

Enjoy one of the prettiest lock-free canal stretches in England where you will leave the Roman city of Bath, pass through the tranquil Sydney Garden tunnels, to Bathampton and onto Claverton. The next 5km provides the unique opportunity to cross two aqueducts, the first being Dundas followed by Avoncliff an hour later. Along the way, enjoy the views of the beautiful Limpley Stoke Valley.

Route 2: Weekly Cruise - Great Bedwyn


Spend the week navigating one of the most beautiful stretches of canal in the UK. Starting in Bath, cruise past the historic Claverton pumping station, over the Dundas and Avoncliff aqueducts and stop off at the picturesque woollen town of Bradford on Avon. Continue through Hilperton, Semington & Seend until you reach one of the true wonders of the canal network - the Caen through the Vale of Pewsey and on to Great Bedwyn.

Route 3:14 Days - Reading Return

Built years ago by the renowned Victorian engineer John Rennie, this historic canal is crammed full of fascinating places to see.

The UNESCO World Heritage City of Bath, down the Limpley Stoke Valley, Dundas Aqueduct, Avoncliff Aqueduct and the historic woollen town of Bradford on Avon. Keep on cruising to Devizes and the breathtaking Caen Hill flight.

Once you've mastered the 29 locks, head The canal continues through Newbury and finally arrives at Reading, where it join's the





Set in glorious Cheshire countryside, this location offers great cruising options for beginners and experts.

We have a large fleet of boats cruising from Bunbury, next to the well-known Bunbury Staircase.

There's a choice of short and long breaks, which will take in the glorious countryside through Cheshire and Shropshire, and the delights of North Wales. Cruising north you'll be heading for the ancient City of Chester. Here you can explore the City's Roman walls, famous Rows galleries full of shops and restaurants, racecourse and award-winning Zoo.

Carry on cruising further north again and you'll reach Ellesmere Port, home of the National Waterways Museum. Or take the Shropshire Union Canal (the 'Shroppie') south with not a city in sight. Head down the Middlewich Branch and cruise to the world famous Anderton Boat Lift.

One of the Seven Wonders of the Waterways, this "Cathedral of the Canals" was built in 1875 to transfer boats between the River Weaver and the Trent & Mersey Canal.

Route 1 : Short Break – Chester and **Ellesmere Port Return**


30 miles, 24 locks and approx 6-8 cruising hours per day. Head north from the base on the Chester. There's plenty to see on the way as you pass through the rolling Cheshire landscape, including the famous "Cheshire Ice Cream Farm" in Tattenhall and "The Crocky Trail" - two great favourites with kids of all ages!

Route 2: Weekly Cruise - Llangollen Return

After Hurleston Junction, turn right onto the most popular canal in Britain - the Llangollen. With only a handful of locks, as well as tunnels, lift bridges and aqueducts along its 45 mile length, the Llangollen really does have a taste of everything the canals have to offer. And there are lots of pubs and restaurants to enjoy along the way.

Route 3:14 Days - Cheshire Ring

Another of those 'once in a lifetime' routes - head north from Middlewich passing the Anderton Boat Lift and onto Preston Brook and Lymm, before turning east into Manchester. Pass the world renowned football stadiums "Old Trafford" and the "Etihad" - make sure you know your red from your Macclesfield Canal, where peace and tranquility returns as the canal becomes a sleepy route





Great Haywood

Perfectly placed at the crossroads of two famous canals, this is the place to start the adventure of a lifetime!

Our base at Great Haywood is just 15 minutes away by boat from the beautiful expanse of water on the Staffordshire & Worcestershire Canal, known as Tixall Wide.

From Tixall Wide, the canal continues through idyllic towns and villages, and Bratch locks, towards Stourport. The canal passes Kinver Edge with its rock houses (well worth a visit, and only a short way from the canal), and plenty of long walks. The Staffordshire & Worcestershire is a beautiful canal with lots of attractions and canalside pubs.

Head north from Great Haywood on the Trent & Mersey Canal to go through the busy town of Stone, leading onto the Potteries.

At Etruria you can turn right onto the Caldon Canal, taking in its magnificent scenery - if you want peace and quiet, this is the canal for you! A short walk from the canal is the Flint Mill and Churnet Valley Railway, with themed weekends great for adults and children - you can even take your dog along!

Head south and you'll immediately pass the grounds of the National Trust's Shugborough Hall. Soon after, you'll be cruising alongside the Cannock Chase Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and the Staffordshire Wildlife Trust's Wolseley Centre. Cruise on to the historic market town of Rugeley, following the canal as it meanders through the Trent Valley towards the famous Fradley Junction. Continue along the Trent & Mersey to the picturesque village of Alrewas and further onto Burton (brewery capital!) and the Bass Museum. Or turn right at Fradley Junction towards Fazeley, a four-hour lock-free cruise.

Route 1: Short Break- Fradley/Fazeley/Alrewas Head south on the Trent & Mersey canal past the grounds of Shugborough Hall (Lord Lichfield former home), where the canal meanders throug the Trent Valley with multiple canalside pubs. Thr

the grounds of Shugborough Hall (Lord Lichfield's former home), where the canal meanders through the Trent Valley with multiple canalside pubs. Three locks descend into the charming Fradley Junction. A right turn takes you onto the Coventry canal which is lock-free all the way to Fazeley, or continue through the locks at Fradley Junction, following the canal to Alrewas, a beautiful village with lovely pubs.

Route 2: Weekly Cruise - Kinver

Featured Routes

Cruise the picturesque Staffordshire & Worcestershire Canal, pass through towns and villages towards Stourport, take in countryside pubs and stop off in Kinver to visit the Rock Houses.

Route 3:14 days - 4 Counties Ring and Caldon

The inland waterway's most popular ring, featuring a lively mix of locks and level cruising. The ring includes the famous 2,670 metres long Harecastle Tunnel, Wedgewood Pottery Visitor Centre, and the Cheshire Locks, also known as "Hearthreak Hill"

Please note that there is an additional charge for cruising on the canals when you set off from Oxford and our Booking Team will let you know all the details when you call. Meander west along the River Thames to Lechlade in the Cotswolds, or east to the dreaming spires of Oxford, the riverside meadows of Abingdon and beyond. Or travel slowly through the Oxfordshire countryside along the Oxford Canal.

Peace. Quiet. Quaintness. Cruising west, Lechlade is a couple of days west of the base - the end of the navigable Thames. You'll find St John's Lock with its statue of Old Father Thames overlooking the water and the bridge where poet Shelley composed 'A Summer Evening Churchyard'. Idyllic, riverside Britain. The perfect place to moor up for a family picnic, or riverside pub lunch.

In the other direction, and just three hours south of the base, you'll reach 'The City of Dreaming Spires', where ancient, modern, classic and contemporary come together. Oxford offers something for everyone and is a great place to moor up and explore.

A longer two week cruise to the east will get you to Windsor and back through peaceful countryside, past Reading, Henley and Marlow. It's a journey through history, so relax and take it all in.

Route 1: Short Break - Lechlade


A popular short break for groups of all sizes. Not too taxing with 14 locks there and back, and miles of countryside to enjoy along the way.

Route 2: Weekly Cruise - Henley on Thames

Head south to the home of the famous rowing and boating regattas. A leisurely cruise, allowing for plenty of time to recharge your batteries.

Route 3:14 days Windsor RTN

Explore even further along the Thames, take in the delights of Hurley, Marlow, Cliveden and Bray, and all the Royal town of Windsor has to offer

Tucked away in the Yorkshire Dales, this is the perfect place to explore the Leeds & Liverpool Canal, with the choice of wide beam as well as narrowboats for hire.

Your holiday starts in the small Yorkshire town of Silsden, which dates back to Saxon times, with its duck pond in the centre of the main street.

Going west from Silsden, the canal passes through the typical Yorkshire stone-built villages of Kildwick and Farnhill and on into a densely wooded area famous for its bluebells and deer.

Through Bradley - a quintessential 'mill village' with a cricket field and country pub. Then on to Skipton, the 'Gateway to the Dales' with a market four days a week, and farmers market once a month.

The canal continues through countryside to the delightful village of Gargrave, where it runs close to the River Aire. It's also the start of a flight of six locks, followed quickly by another six locks at Bank Newton, said to be the most beautiful on the whole canal system.

These take the canal up into the Dales with stunning views, until you reach the hamlet of East Marton, with its famous double arch bridge. From here, continue on through the countryside to the three locks at Greenberfield.

These locks take the canal onto the summit, and through Salterforth to Foulridge, and the famous mile-long tunnel. If you have longer on the canal, and you're feeling energetic, you can carry on through the Lancashire cotton towns, over the Burnley Embankment, and onto Wigan with its flight of 21 locks.

On a 10 day or two-week break, you could cruise on to connect with the leafy Calder & Hebble Navigation at Cooper Bridge, and travel to Sowerby Bridge and back.

If you decide to travel east from Silsden towards Leeds, you'll encounter a series of swing bridges and the famous Grade I listed Bingley Five Rise locks, one of the Seven Wonders of the Waterways. There are a few more locks before you reach Saltaire, a World Heritage Site built by Sir Titus Salt for his mill workers. Here you can visit Salts Mill, with an art gallery showing the work of David Hockney, café and various other shops

Leaving Saltaire, you travel parallel with the River Aire into the centre of Leeds, where you can moor up in Leeds Dock and visit the Royal Armouries Museum and other local attractions.

Route 1 : Short Break- Gargrave Return


Visit skipton and its medieval castle before you cruise through beautiful, varying countryside crossing over the River Aire, via a stunning stone-built aqueduct. Gargrave offers a great stop to enjoy this fantastic location bordering the Yorkshire Dales National Park.

Route 2 : Weekly Cruise - Leeds Return

Cruise to the vibrant city of Leeds, with sites to enjoy along the way including Cliffe Castle, Bingley Five Rise staircase locks, and UNESCO World Heritage town of Saltaire.

Route 3:14 Days - Two Counties

Pass Skipton, East Marton, Gargrave, Burnley, and Blackburn on your cruise to Wigan. Filled with great places to stop and eat, this cruise through the Pennines is a must for those who appreciate history and beauty.

The perfect place to start an adventure on the Grand Union and Oxford canals, in the heart of the canal network.



The historic market town of Warwick itself offers medieval timber framed buildings to see, the beautiful Collegiate Church of St Mary, Warwick Racecourse, plus a variety of museums, shops, cafés, restaurants, parks and gardens.

Just a short cruise from Braunston, in the heart of the Midlands canal system, Stockton Top Marina offers a wide range of cruising. Here we are ideally placed for the Warwickshire Ring, but you can also wind steadily down the South Oxford Canal, or wander round to the North Oxford, and up onto the lock-free Ashby Canal.

Alternatively, travel down the South Oxford Canal to the City of Oxford to explore all that this world-famous destination has to offer, including the Bodleian Library and the Ashmolean Museum. Or cruise to Stratford-upon-Avon, home of the Royal Shakespeare Theatre



It is a Scheduled Ancient Monument, a Grade I Listed structure and was granted World Heritage status in June 2009, putting it on an equal footing with the Great Barrier Reef and Statue of Liberty! It towers above the heart of this breathtaking World Heritage site, stretching from Gledrid Bridge near Rhoswiel in Wales, to the Horseshoe Falls in Llantysilio, on the River Dee.

On the doorstep of our picturesque Trevor base, cross the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct for the experience of a lifetime and amazing views across the Dee Valley.

The delightful Eisteddfod of Llangollen is just a two-hour cruise away. Places to visit include the Steam Railway and famous Horseshoe Falls.

Navigate the Llangollen to experience one of the UK's most stunning stretches of canal, passing through the Welsh mountains and Shropshire lakes. There are tunnels, lift bridges and not too many locks to negotiate.

With seven miles of The Montgomery Canal restored to Gronwyn Wharf, a cruise along 'The Monty' is a must for conservation and wildlife enthusiasts. With its 'Site of Special Scientific Interest' and 'Special Area of Conservation in Wales' awards, this canal is a haven for wildlife.



Featured Routes

Route 1 : Short Break - Trevor to Ellesmere

Cruise across the spectacular Pontcysyllte Aqueduct, through one lift bridge at Froncysyllte, two tunnels and then on to Chirk Aqueduct. Meander along to the small Shropshire town of Ellesmere with its 'mini lakes', passing through only two locks on the way.

Route 2 : Weekly Cruise - Trevor to Wrenbury

Across the Pontcysyllte Aqueduct and through Ellesmere, to the Meres. Follow the twists and turns to Whitchurch and moor up – or carry on to Grindley Brook Locks. At Wrenbury, there's an electric lift bridge, a choice of pubs and some great countryside walks.

Route 3: Weekly Cruise -Trevor/ Montgomery Canal/ Ellesmere & Llangollen

Enjoy a relaxing couple of days on the Montgomery Canal, and visit the popular market town of Ellesmere, where there are plenty of mooring places. There are some nice shops, an excellent deli, and even a supermarket alongside the canal. Carry on for a couple of miles and you pass a series of Meres, full of wildlife.

On your return (and time permitting) go up to Llangollen, a 2-hour trip through the beautiful countryside of the Dee Valley. Bookings are required for passage through the locks onto the Montgomery Canal.

Explore the Shropshire Lake District and the UNESCO World Heritage Pontcysyllte Aqueduct, or head into Cheshire to visit the Anderton Boat Lift.

Located on the Prees Branch of the Llangollen Canal in the Shropshire countryside, Whixall is one of Britain's most rural marinas.

It takes just half an hour cruise to join the main line then you decide to turn left for Llangollen, or right to Hurleston Junction and the Shropshire Union Canal. If you go left, you're immediately rewarded with seven miles of quiet, winding canal leading into the historic market town of Ellesmere, in the heart of the Shropshire Lake District.

Nineteen miles and only two locks later, you'll reach the historic town of Llangollen, with its many attractions. There are three stunning canal features to add excitement to your journey. Chirk Aqueduct takes you across the border into North Wales, followed by Chirk Tunnel, and then the 'jewel in the crown' of the whole canal network, the UNESCO World Heritage Pontcysyllte Aqueduct.

Heading the other way along the Llangollen Canal, you'll pass through the historic market town of Whitchurch and through the Grindley Brook flight of locks.

There is a lock keeper on hand to help you and afterwards you have six miles to relax before Wrenbury Lift Bridge. This bridge is electrically operated with a waterways key. A sharp left turn at Hurleston Junction guides you onto the Shropshire Union Canal towards Chester.

There are many attractions to enjoy in the ancient City of Chester, including the cathedral, castle, racecourse, Roman walls, zoo, bars and restaurants.

Featured Routes

Route 1: Short Break - Chirk Return


The rolling green fields of Shropshire and Cheshire provide the backdrop to the canal on this cruise. A leisurely trip with only two locks in each direction leads you to the village of Chirk, with its historic buildings and town trail. Cross the 21-metre high aqueduct and turn just before the tunnel. There's no turning point after the tunnel. You'll find a choice of pubs in Chirk, including "the last pub in England."

Route 2 : Weekly Cruise – Llangollen Return

The Llangollen Canal is possibly the most popular in Britain, with attractions for families or groups of friends. Picturesque countryside takes you through Shropshire, Cheshire and North Wales, with plenty of canalside pubs. A camera is a must for the canal architecture and views, particularly Pontcysyllte. An unusual feature of this canal is a 2 mph water flow, so your return journey will be quicker than the outbound trip.

Route 3 : Weekly Cruise – Chester Return

An interesting cruise, with staircase locks and lift bridges adding to the canal experience, as well as the beautiful Cheshire countryside. The Llangollen Canal goes through the pretty towns of Whitchurch and Wrenbury, before descending into Hurleston Junction. Here you join the Shropshire Union Canal taking you into the historic city of Chester.



Wootton Wawen

Explore Shakespeare country, Stratford-upon-Avon and the waterways flowing through the 'Heart of England'.

Perfect for cruises to Birmingham and Stratford-upon-Avon, our base at Wootton Wawen is one of our most popular starting points.

Heading south on the Stratford Canal, you cross the 145-metre long Edstone Aqueduct, the longest aqueduct in England.

The Royal Shakespeare Company is on the banks of the River Avon and you can moor up in Bancroft Basin in the centre of Stratford to soak up the history and culture. It's a six-hour cruise from Wootton Wawen, so we suggest you spend your first night at Wilmcote, where you'll find Mary Arden's Farm. At Stratford, if you have time, you can buy a licence and lock down onto the River Avon, to cruise through idyllic countryside to Evesham and Tewkesbury.

Go north from Wootton Wawen and you can head for the bright city lights of Birmingham. With more canals than Venice, as well as great attractions, shopping and places to eat, Birmingham is full of canal history. You can moor up in Gas Street Basin, close to Brindleyplace, the Sea Life Centre and Mailbox Shopping Centre.

If the bustling city is not your thing, then keep it rural by heading onto the Grand Union Canal at Kingswood Junction. Cruise down to historic Warwick with its famous castle and tackle the famous Hatton Flight of locks.


















Dip your toe in the water with our day boat hire.

Available at most of our bases, our day boats offer a great way to try canal boating and get the hang of steering, mooring up and working the locks*.

All our day boats are equipped with a fridge, toilet, cutlery, crockery, a kettle and a hob, so you can pack a picnic and head out for the day with everything you need, or plan a stop at a canalside pub.

Tuition is included as part of our day boat hire package. Prices start from just £10 per person. Cruising hours during the season are from 9am to 4pm.

Our day boats carry a maximum of ten people and have both indoor and outdoor seating. Check the layout with the Booking Team as they are all slightly different.

Day boat hire routes & prices

Cheshire - from Bunbury on the Shropshire Union Canal near Tarporley, you can cruise south for six miles, and travel across the impressive Grade II* listed Nantwich Aqueduct, with panoramic views across the town.

Shropshire - from Whixall on the Prees Branch of the Llangollen Canal, you can head east to Whitchurch in just over two hours, or west to Ellesmere in the heart of the Shropshire Lake District in around three hours.

Staffordshire - from Great Haywood on the Trent & Mersey Canal you can travel south to the historic market town of Rugeley, passing through the Cannock Chase Forest Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, or north to the village of Sandon with a choice of pubs along the way.

Warwickshire - from Wootton Wawen on the Stratford Canal, you can head south to the historic village of Wilmcote, passing over the impressive Edstone Aqueduct, or north to Lowsonford, through the remains of the Forest of Arden.

Wrexham - from Trevor on the Llangollen Canal in North Wales, you can cruise east across the Pontcysyllte and Chirk aqueducts and on to Chirk Bank, or west to the pretty town of Llangollen, on the edge of the Berwyn Mountains.

Worcestershire - from Tardebigge on the Worcester & Birmingham Canal near Bromsgrove, you can cruise north along the Worcester & Birmingham Canal to Kings Norton Junction, passing through fields, wooded sections and two canal tunnels.

On our website, we've published 10 new destination maps to guide you on a perfect day out afloat.

Alcohol – a sad but necessary warning

Whilst we want everyone to enjoy their day boat cruise, our primary concern is for your health and safety, and that of others on the waterway. Our base staff will not allow excessive amounts of alcohol to be taken aboard the boats, and will decline to handover any boat where they feel this may be an issue. This would result in you forfeiting your booking payment.

If your boat crew is reported causing disruption on the waterway, the crew will be escorted from the boat and all payments and security deposits will be forfeit. The crew will also be reported to waterway authorities, which could result in prosecution.

However, kettles, irons, hairdryers, heaters and vacuum cleaners usually need more power, so they can't be used. It's not possible to guarantee the battery powered system will provide a constant supply of power to any electrical device, including medical appliances. We've installed internet hubs on all our boats, except those from Silsden, giving you 1GB of free WiFi. Connection to the internet is available if there's a signal, but the download is limited and the signal is likely to be poor in rural areas.
